

Birds of a Feather

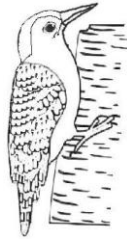


*Not all birds have the same beaks and feet.

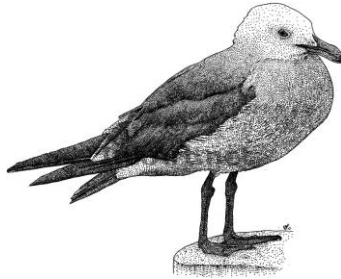

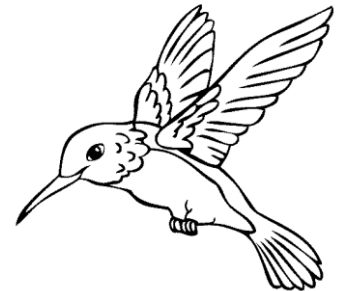
Birds of a Feather



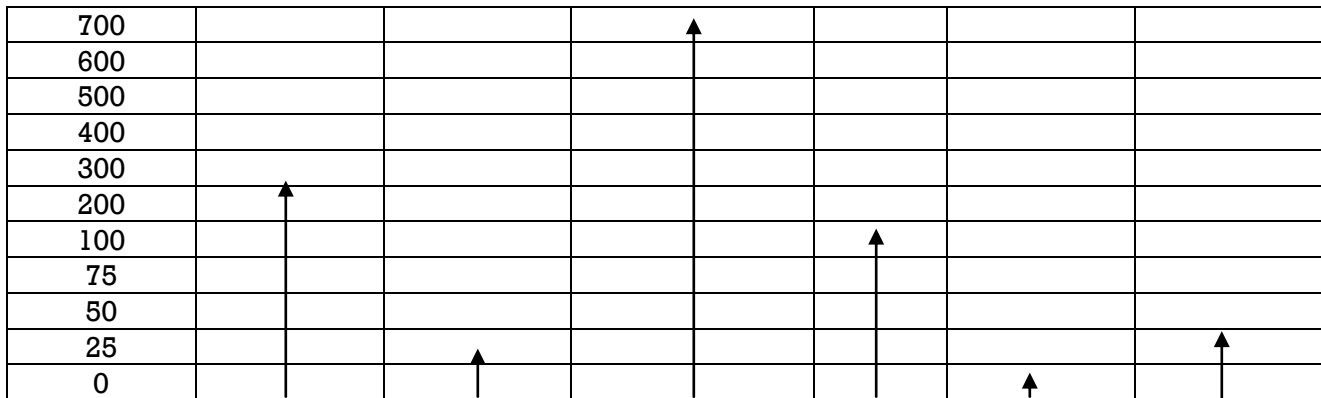
*Birds fly very differently from each other.
